





## FROM LGBT TO LGBTQ+ TO LGBTQIA+

Why does the acronym to describe sexual orientations and gender identities that aren't heterosexual or cisgender keep getting longer?

We all want to belong. We all want to be seen for who we are. And the acronym that is associated with the queer and trans community has been expanding over the years in an effort to make sure that all are included in that community. LGTBQIA+ stands for Lesbian, Gay,



Bisexual, Transgender, Queer and/or Questioning, Intersex, Asexual, and the countless affirmative ways in which people choose to self-identify.

Language is a powerful tool, morphing all the time, and the expanding acronym hits on age-old struggles around issues of sexuality, identity, gender, and freedom of expression. Just like Side by Side's embrace of sharing personal pronouns in 2018, we invite our supporters to also join us on this journey as we ensure that ALL our queer and trans youth feel valued, included, safe, and respected.

# ADVANCING THE JOB SKILLS AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM AT REAL ALTERNATIVES

In addition to a stable place to live, the Real Alternatives transitional housing program provides youth with teams of specialists to help them with the life skills and mental health support they need to live happily and successfully on their own.

But according to Real Alternatives Director Ahnjolique Haskins, "our job skills and career development efforts have not had the degree of success we want. Due to the trauma and upheaval foster youth experience during their formative years, the skills they need to find and maintain employment aren't well developed."

Rebecca Hathorn, East Bay Regional Director, adds, "Relationships can be very challenging for our youth. They have not always had good relationships with people in a position of power. When a boss is giving feedback, our youth may hear it in a way that makes them defensive, or even quit." Real Alternatives can help with coaching around relationships, but the program doesn't have the connections necessary to facilitate job placements and needed help to create a customized approach that would better serve our clients.

Thanks to generous funding from the Walter S. Johnson Foundation, Real Alternatives is now working with strategic consultants from Groundwork Social Sector Consulting to develop that approach. "Building employment skills and an employment track record is a must if these youth are going to have a shot at self-sufficiency," said Joe Herrity, Principal at Groundwork Consulting. After talking to staff, youth, and local small businesses in the community, the Groundwork team is designing a phased approach that will seamlessly integrate with the work of existing Real Alternatives staff.

The Walter S. Johnson Foundation believes in the potential of transition-age foster youth to become successful adults with supportive services. We're pleased to be a partner in Real Alternatives' job skill and career development pilot, a program which recognizes each youth's unique strengths and helps them overcome their challenges.

"The Real Alternatives model is awesome," says Vamsey Palagummi, also with Groundwork Consulting. "The expertise of the housing specialists, youth specialists, and case managers, is inspired, and the relationships between the staff and the youth is paramount. We are not looking to overturn the system, but to provide staff with tools and a structure that complements already existing systems while achieving better success for the youth."

In the first phase, youth will "get ready to get ready" by setting goals for accountability and success such as showing up on time to case management meetings 5 times in a row. Phase two is about building self-efficacy by gaining and keeping employment. In the final phase, Side by Side will build relationships with local organizations such as the Workforce Development Board and the Hayward Chamber of Commerce to create ongoing career pathways and opportunities to provide sustaining results.

Positive change is coming to Real Alternatives! We expect that the plan developed by Groundwork Consulting will begin implementation in the coming year.



# PROJECT SOAR BRINGS POSITIVE CHANGE TO NORTH BAY SCHOOLS

When students in Petaluma's Casa Grande High School's Success 101 class were struggling over Zoom last year, teacher Pam McNees called her trusted collaborator, YouThrive Program Supervisor Vernon Pope-Banks. "Vernon started leading Zoom breakout rooms in my classes with the students most in need. He was so successful at helping them."

The result is Project Soar, a new collaboration between YouThrive and Community Counseling, that is being piloted at Casa Grande High School and Kenilworth Middle School. Funded by a grant from the Sonoma County Vintners Foundation, Project Soar is bringing three tiers of mental health education, group intervention workshops and parent outreach, and individual therapy to Petaluma students. "Our multi-tiered approach allows us to focus on both prevention AND intervention," says Pope-Banks.

The first tier includes bilingual in-class presentations, game-based educational tutorials to break down learning barriers, and basic needs case management. "We are discussing important topics such as self-care, anger awareness, and coping skills, while also providing learning strategies," says Community Services Program Director Denisse Mendoza. "But we are acutely aware that many of these students are in financial crisis, which will affect their academic and emotional health. So, we provide the case management and refer them to additional resources for financial support when needed."

YouThrive's successful ten-week group workshops form the backbone of Tier 2, along with bilingual parent outreach and engagement. Tier 3 rounds out the pilot with an enhanced focus on mental health, providing up to five bilingual 1:1 Community Counseling sessions to students that need additional support, with priority given to the Tier 2 participants. Bianca Pulido, one of the Community Counseling staff conducting individual sessions, comments, "for many of the Spanish-speaking youth we are seeing, just to have the space to talk to somebody is huge." Her colleague, Cesia Jovel, agrees, "We are offering a safe space for the youth to think and talk about their own experiences in a positive regard and without judgement."

"I'm thrilled with the results so far," said McNees. "Side by Side is truly a fantastic partner. I really appreciate all the efforts that they are making to connect to my students!" Based on the success of this year's pilot and expanded funding, Side by Side hopes to bring this innovative model to even more schools throughout the North Bay soon.

Student Accessibility Services at COM, "The partnership with Side by Side has provided immense opportunity for us to expand our mental health services and supports to students, with particular focus on marginalized and minoritized student groups. Students continue to struggle during this pandemic and we want to cultivate community support spaces that center the unique experiences and identities of our students."

Now in its second year, YouThrive's weekly drop-in workshop series, Call to Courage, is for students of color to delve into and realize a richer understanding of how race, class, and health affect our lives. YouThrive Supervisor Vernon Pope-Banks explains, "We cover identity, culture and privilege, the power of vulnerability, navigating emotions and relationships, social justice, mental health first-aid, and restorative practices." Recent student feedback included how helpful it was "to openly talk about things that people are choosing to be closeminded or emotionally closed up about."

Through the new virtual Our Space LGBTQIA+ group, COM students can connect weekly with other queer, trans, non-binary, and intersex students on campus. Our Space's Educational Youth Advocate, Jasmine Cervantes leads discussions about college life, healthy relationships, chosen family, and building community. Students also talk about their hobbies and favorite classes as well as their home lives and relationships. Conversations about The Bachelorette can turn into deep conversations about sexism, racism, and heteronormativity.

Aman Basdeo Fitzgerald, Our Space Program Manager, said, "The Our Space Team has been attending panel discussions and student orientations to introduce our services to other COM providers. It's been really awesome to see how COM staff are working to provide as much exposure as possible to programs like ours as they embark on another virtual semester."

As services return to in-person and participation continues to grow, both programs hope to scale the program in the coming year. Larry Woodland, Side by Side's Chief Program Officer said, "Our Space and YouThrive are looking forward to a new partnership with Santa Rosa Junior College in Spring 2022."


# EXPANSION AND COLLABORATION ARE HALLMARKS OF SIDE BY SIDE SERVICES

The transition to college life is easier for some students than it is for others, especially those who are the first in their families to attend college. For students of color, the college environment may feel isolating. The same is true for LGBTQIA+ students.

To lessen any sense of isolation, an innovative collaboration originally developed in 2020 when College of Marin (COM) initially reached out to YouThrive and was extended this fall to also include Side by Side's Our Space program. According to Stormy Miller Sabia, Director of


#### EXPENSES BY TYPE (% and 000's)





(% and 000's)




#### REVENUE BY TYPE (%)

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
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
